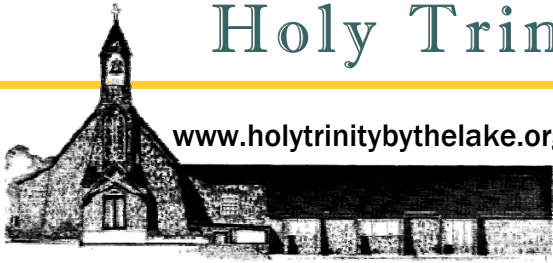

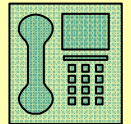
## LET US KNOW IF YOU'D PREFER AN E-COPY OF THE NEWSLETTER

## Episcopal R&D Seeks Storm Disaster Relief Funds

Severe storms and flooding have battered regions of the U.S. since April. Most recently, a massive tornado struck Joplin, Missouri, on May 22, killing more than 120 people. The storm damaged over 2,000 buildings and filled streets with debris. Rescue crews are still working to locate survivors. "We have not lost any members, praise God," said the Rev. Frank Sierra, rector of St. Philip's, the town's sole Episcopal church. "A couple of our parishioners have lost homes and others have family members with injuries, but nothing life threatening." Episcopal Relief & Development is responding through the Episcopal Diocese of West Missouri. Initial funds will assist survivors with support such as food, gas cards and emergency shelter. "As things are still in the rescue phase, the diocese will continue assessing needs as the situation changes," said Abigail Nelson, Senior Vice President for Programs. "We are standing ready to assist as advised." Last month, dozens of tornadoes leveled areas of the South and Southeast, causing several hundred deaths and millions of dollars in damage. This month, Southern states have also been hit with major flooding from the Mississippi River. Episcopal Relief & Development is supporting congregations in the Episcopal Dioceses of East Carolina, North Carolina, Alabama and Atlanta, among others, in ministering to those affected with food, vouchers for essential items, shelter and pastoral care. As inclement weather continues affecting communities nationwide, please remember that one of the most important things we can do is pray for people who have lost loved ones and homes, those in disaster-prone areas and responders working to save lives and address needs. 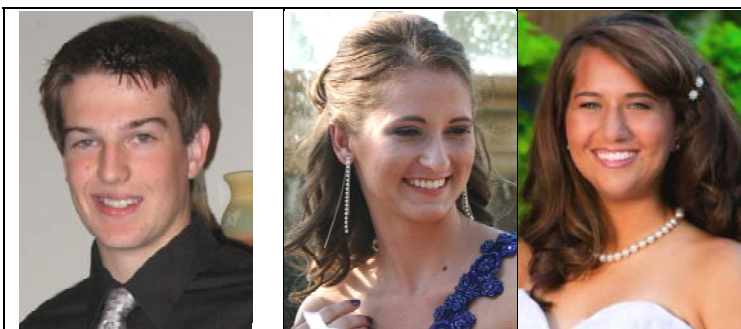

## United Thank Offering Is Ongoing

Holy Trinity has been a regular contributor to this ministry, routinely contributing around \$500 per ingathering each year. Traditionally, we have conducted semi-annual appeals for our "blue boxes" to be emptied of change, and replaced with a corresponding check. The offering is blessed and submitted to the UTO office.



Through the United Thank Offering, men, women, and children nurture the habit of giving daily thanks to God. These prayers of thanksgiving start when we recognize and name our many daily blessings. Those who participate in the United Thank Offering have discovered that thankfulness leads to generosity. UTO combines these generous offerings to fund significant projects that make a real difference in the work of the Episcopal Church and in the Anglican Communion and a real difference in people's lives.

The history of UTO is telling. At the Women's Auxiliary meeting during the General Convention of 1886, but at the offering, the women had only given a total of eighty-seven dollars. Dismayed at the meager amount, organizers thought that if the women knew where their money was going, they might be inspired to contribute more generously. Consequently, it was suggested that the offering be earmarked for a specific project.

In the early years the Women's Auxiliary collected the money at the General Convention and their focus was on expanding the mission of the church. Grants supported training women in the church, supporting and sending women missionaries domestically and overseas and funding the building of schools, hospitals and church buildings all over the USA.

Every penny of our offerings are added to amounts sent in by other Episcopal churches in the U.S. and used for mission projects. If you would like to take part in this work get a Blue Box from the rack in the narthex. Use the box prayerfully and add the amount you collect to our next ingathering which is slated for the weekend of June 26. 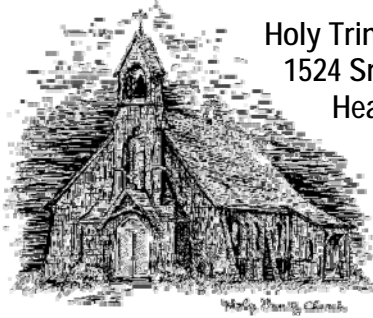
### Austin Street Centre Shelter Food

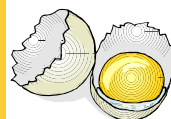
