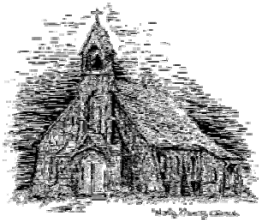

Parish Finance (and other) News

By now most will have received a letter from the Junior Warden informing you of a matching grant for replacing the windows in the Administration wing.

The grant is for \$12,500, or one half the total cost of purchasing and installing these low-maintenance, metal frame, energy efficient window. Presently the wood molding around several of the windows is rotting. There are air gaps in most that let the A/C out in the summer and the heat in the winter. This will enable future generations to not have to deal with deteriorating wood and help our utility bill. To date we have already received 20% of the necessary donations to receive the full grant.

Our Finance Committee has been hard at work talking with several banks about refinancing our mortgage. With the lower interest rate comes lower payments but, (and this is an important "but") the finance committee, with the concurrence of the Vestry will con-

tinue to make the same mortgage payments we are making at the higher interest rate. In addition, our other bank note, the Crump Fund, will be paid off in two years. At that time we will take the money from those payments and apply them to the mortgage. But, wait there is still more. Doing all that and applying some of the funds from leasing space in the Education Building to the mortgage the Finance Committee projects that we can pay the principle down to \$200,00 in five years, thus greatly reducing the drain on our operating budget. This is truly good news. Keep their work in your prayers while they pursue this opportunity.

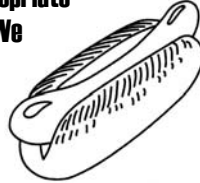
The Brotherhood of St. Andrew Herbsfest 2011

Pick up your daily offering box in the Narthex. The ingathering will be in June.

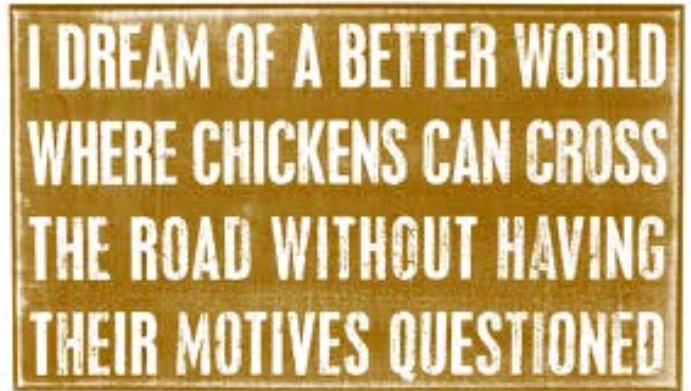

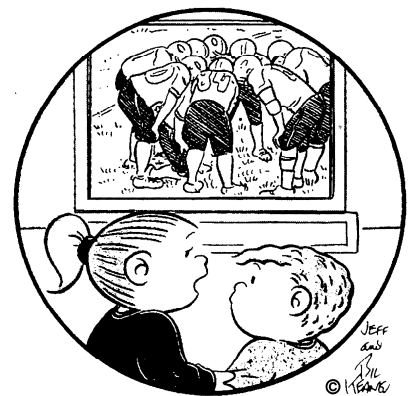


THANKSGIVING

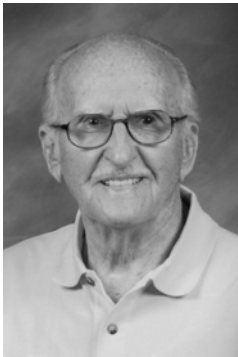

JOHN & BETH TAYLOR WINDOW DEDICATION NOV. 6 AT 10:30 SERVICE

The Taylors began attending Holy Trinity in Forney in 1972. Since then, they were active in virtually every ministry at our church. Our vestry and rector thought it fitting to craft and dedicate one of our stained glass windows to the couple. Betsy Greene has put forth huge efforts into the project, including amassing the historical data, supervising the window installation (as well as other window repairs) and planning the dedication Nov. 6 at the 10:30 am service. Among Taylor family members attending are: Sandra and Fred Green

(daughter & son-in-law); John H Taylor, Jr (son); Jennifer De La Court (granddaughter and daughter of John H Taylor, Jr.); Hubert and Margaret Taylor (son and daughter-in-law); Natalie and Josh Goble (granddaughter and her husband, (daughter of Hubert Taylor)); and Jack and Cameron Goble (great grandsons and grandsons of Hubert Taylor).



JOHN H. TAYLOR (1910 - 2005)

On February 2, 1910, John was born in Doncaster, Yorkshire, England. He was the 5th of 10 surviving children of a coal-mining family. To escape this life he joined the British Army when he was 18 and served 6 years in the prestigious Queen's Bays Horse Guards at St James Palace. Leaving the army, he went to work for Standard Oil, touring and inspecting their European facilities. In 1938, he came to the United States to do the same work for Standard Oil and

covered most of the country. In 1942, the job took him to Tyler, Texas. He stayed at the Blackstone Hotel where Beth Ann Rainey worked. Two weeks after meeting, they married. At first they lived in Houston where John did electrical work.

John was not an American citizen, so was ineligible to serve in the armed services. He enlisted in the USAAF and was naturalized. Too old for combat, he trained gunnery officers. He was stationed in Idaho when a B17 nose gun broke loose, while firing, and destroyed the cockpit of the airplane. Only John and one other survived this tragedy. By mistake, his family in England was notified that he had been killed. This error was not rectified until 1978, when Beth and his children prevailed upon John to visit Yorkshire and he was reunited with his surviving family.

Post-war, John (now a master electrician), Beth, and their three children lived in the Oak Cliff area of Dallas, attending St George's and then St Paul's. They moved to Antigua Bay and joined the congregation in Forney in November, 1972. John wired-in the church building when it was moved in 1973.

John died on January 17, 2005 and is buried at Rest Haven.



BETH ANN TAYLOR (1920 -2010)

Beth Ann Rainey's family came from East Tennessee to Graham, Texas. She was born there on December 29, 1920, the second of five children. When she was four, her father and older brother died of tuberculosis. When Beth was 8 or 9, her mother found herself unable to care for four young children and took them to the State Orphanage in Corsicana. Beth and her siblings lived there until each was 18, but never lost contact with their mother or each other.

She received a one-year typing scholarship to North Texas State Teachers' College, then moved to Tyler to live with her mother. There she met and married John Taylor.

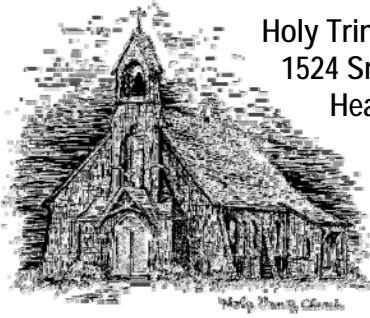
The Taylors were active in all of the churches they attended. Every church saw them hold most offices. John was acolyte master at St George's, St Paul's, and Holy Trinity. He would sit in the first row and critique that day's acolyte from shoes to comportment. (No flip-flops or slouching allowed!) They attended and led marriage encounter groups. They helped to start our school. Beth served often as Senior Warden - and was famous for passing the plate twice if not enough money came in to pay the bills. Rev. George Luck says her decisions were always in the best interests of Holy Trinity.

John and Beth Ann held separate jobs: John worked at wiring-in telephone equipment and Beth managed the Toys-R-Us in Wynne-wood. Otherwise, they were always together - church, golf, ballroom dancing. Their extended family was very close; sharing meals, camping, picnics and holidays.

Beth died on July 12, 2010 in DeSoto and is buried at Rest Haven in the same grave as her beloved John.
