The Ebb and Flow of Parish Finances (Part 1 of 2)

I have been asked how to interpret the financial information we print in the newsletter each month. The following is my attempt to bring "some" clarity to the snapshot of our finances.

- There are three kinds of cash assets: (1) income for operating budget [e.g. pledge plate offering, etc.], (2) designated contributions [e.g. building fund, memorial fund, etc. or a special project like the columbarium], and (3) the Endowment.
- There are two kinds of income: (1) undesignated and (2) designated gifts.
- Undesignated income goes into the operating budget that covers the day-to-day operation of the Parish.
- Designated gifts go to: (1) the Operating Budget (2) the Building Fund, (3) one of the Special Funds or (4) the Endowment as designated by the contributor.
- If the funds are designated they must be applied to the area for which they are designated. Thus, we could have a positive bank account but not have money for an expense in the operating budget because our cash balance is designated for things not in the operating budget.
- There are three kinds of expenditures: (1) operating expenses, (2) building fund and (3) designated from special funds.
- Designated funds cannot be used for the operating budget unless designated by the donor or special fund for that purpose.
- Designated funds must be used for the purpose for which they were contributed.
- Endowment Funds are not spent but at some future date a portion of the income generated by the funds invested can be used for outreach or seed money for a new program. The Endowment is not intended to be used for general operations.
- We have three kinds of assets: (1) cash on hand, (2) real property [e.g., land, building and contents], and (3) investments.
- We have three kinds of liabilities: (1) Mortgage, (2) outstanding bills and (3) depreciation of real property.

WHERE HAVE YOU BEEN SOWN?

Have you ever tried retelling some of Jesus' stories into your current experience? It can sometimes be fun but always it makes us think about the very things He wanted us to think about. THE COLUMBARIUM AT HOLY TRINITY IS SOON TO BECOME A REALITY!

Plans are being drawn up to begin construction of Phase I of our columbarium project. This phase will contain 48 niches in three rows. It will be the center section of the columbarium wall, with Phases II and III on each side. In all, there will be 144 niches in the completed project.

Each niche is suitably sized to contain one or two urns. The purchase price for a niche is presently \$2000. It is estimated that there will need to be 25 subscriptions for niches to begin Phase I construction.

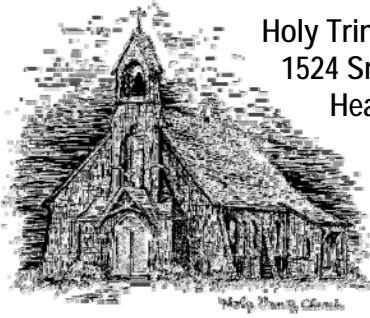


In Memoriam

THANKS FOR YOUR GENEROSITY IN SIGNING UP FOR YOUTH DINNERS

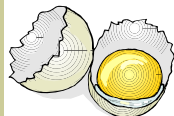
