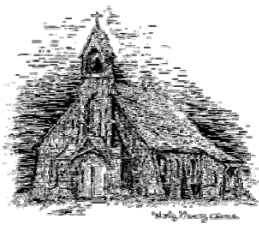

**WEDNESDAY MORNING
CHRISTIAN FORMATION CLASS
RESUMES SEPTEMBER 14**

The Wednesday morning 9am Christian Formation class will resume meeting on Wednesday, 9/14/11. We will be using *Bridges to Contemplative Living Book 1, Advent, and Lent*. These booklets are available from www.mertoninstitute.org for 5.95 each or from Amazon. Mertoninstitute.org also has a package deal with all 8 books plus Advent and Lent for \$55...several of us are enthusiastic enough to get the package. Using readings from Thomas Merton and other contemplative writers, we will be using a process like Lectio Divina to learn to listen for God's voice in the readings and in our responses. As usual, we will have homework of meditation, journaling, and anything else I can think of! As always, you can come when you can-the lessons are not really built on one another, but you won't want to miss a single session!

What do we mean by Contemplative Living? "Life is a spiritual journey. Contemplative living is a way of responding to our everyday experiences by consciously attending to our relationships. It deepens our awareness of our connectedness and communion with others, becomes a positive force of change in our lives, and provides meaningful direction to our journey. Ultimately, contemplative living leads us to a sense of well-being, profound gratitude, and a clearer understanding of our purpose in life." (*Bridges to Contemplative Living, Book 1*)

THE COLUMBARIUM AT HOLY TRINITY IS SOON TO BECOME A REALITY!

Plans are being drawn up to begin construction of Phase I of our columbarium project. This phase will contain 48 niches in three rows. It will be the center section of the columbarium wall, with Phases II and III on each side. In all, there will be 144 niches in the completed project.

Each niche is suitably sized to contain one or two urns. The purchase price for a niche is presently \$2000. It is estimated that there will need to be 25 subscriptions for niches to begin Phase I construction.

STAINED GLASS WINDOW REPAIRS ALMOST COMPLETE

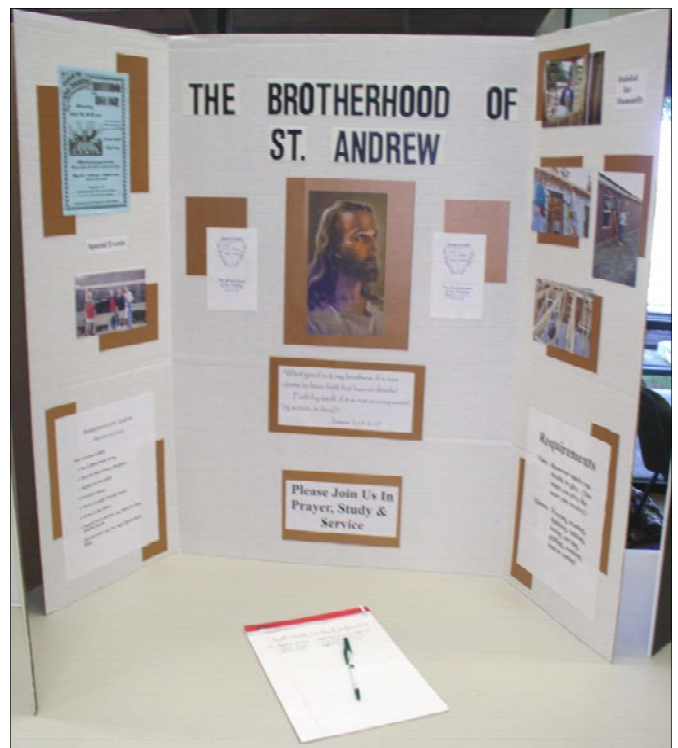

Although the windows were intact, their frames had to be replaced and repainted. Then, the old Plexiglas with stainless screws had to be cleaned and replaced. New gutters were also installed and we are awaiting the completion and installation of the new John and Beth Taylor window. Look forward to a dedication service for that window.

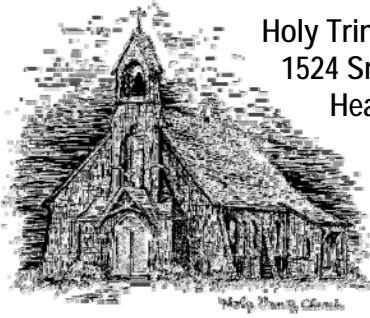
HEADS OF ORGANIZATIONS WILL MEET SATURDAY MORNING FOR DISCUSSION/MINISTRY FAIR SETUP

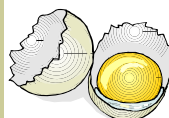
